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GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE

Brothers,

Happy New Year!! I hope all of you and your families are doing well. We are now officially halfway through the Columbian year, and I can't help but reflect upon the accomplishments of the past six months.

·We started off the Columbian year with our Annual Golf Fundraiser tournament at the Rancho Murrieta Country Club. Even though we didn't have as many golfers sign up as we would have liked, everyone who played had a fun time, and the August weather was very kind to us. Raffle prizes were super; the food was plenty, and most importantly, our very own St. Mel School benefitted from the generosity of everyone involved.

·Though not directly involved as a Council event, our membership significantly participated in the 11th Annual Men's Day of Faith. Most of the 200+ attendees started the day with the Rosary and Mass. Father Larry Richards talked about becoming the man God created us to be. In the afternoon, Father George from Saint Clare Parish spoke and presented his relic collection. This type of event is directly related to COR, or Latin for "heart". Supreme is encouraging Councils to implement COR programs that empower Catholic men to live their faith and serve their families, parishes, and communities.

·Our Faith in Action Program saw us conduct two Baby Supply Drives, resulting in well over \$1,000 of baby supplies being donated to the Sacramento Life Center. We also hosted a Blood Drive. Our Keep Christ in Christmas Card sales nearly sold out on the first weekend. In November, we sponsored the Catholic Essay Contest, and the entire St. Mel 8th grade participated, writing about their three favorite Popes. The winner received a \$100 gift card, and the runner-up received a \$50 gift card. All participants received a free ice cream sundae from Leatherby's.

·Our Annual ID Drive for the Intellectually Disabled Spaghetti Dinner and Dessert Auction was one of the most successful events in recent history. Camp ReCreation and the Laurel Ruff Transition School again benefitted from the generosity of all involved.

·As for new membership, in December, we welcomed our second new brother of 25/26 to the Council.

·In addition to our charitable events and their contributions, we contributed to the State and Northern California Chapters with donations for an Ultrasound Machine and donated to the Bishop's Altar Server recognition event at Saint John the Baptist in Folsom.

·A special mention for our Council brothers who volunteered to help at the Carmelite Monastery in October, for their relic event featuring Saint Therese of Lisieux, also known as the Little Flower.

·On a sad note, we lost a Council brother and long-time parishioner, Bob Mayer, who passed away unexpectedly this past December 11th. He will be fondly remembered and missed by our Council brothers and St. Mel parishioners. Please pray for his repose and for

comfort and strength for his wife, Patti, all his family, and all this community of faith. Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let a perpetual light shine upon him!

As my Grand Knight's second term started in July, I outlined a few goals for our four core fundraisers – ID Drive for the Intellectually Disabled, Saint Patrick's Day Dinner, Wheelchair Mission, and Golf Tournament. The initial goal was to have Committees assist the Chairmen for each event in time to do pre-planning, learn what past Chairmen have done, and in time to promote the event to the Parish. Four brothers have stepped up. Brother David Vincent chaired the ID Drive, SK/DGK Tremain Hayhoe will chair the St. Patrick's Day dinner, SK Trevor Harris will chair the Wheelchair Mission, and brother John Watson has stepped up again to chair the Golf tournament. Another goal was to have compliance with the required Diocese of Sacramento Safe Environment and Supreme Safe Environment training. Our Council Officers, as required by Supreme guidelines, are in full compliance. STAR Council/membership – As a result of meeting our membership goal from Supreme in 24/25, Supreme raised the bar on us from 12 to 13 new members this year to reach STAR Council status. This year, we have scheduled membership drives prior to our scheduled Welcoming Ceremonies.

For the second half of this year, I am hoping that the remaining events we are hosting and planning will inspire members to help in the planning of these events when the callout for volunteers happens. Also, I am hoping for a Council member to step up and volunteer to lead COR (mentioned earlier). COR activities aren't about fundraising or meeting any particular KofC quota; it's about gathering brother Knights together to express and deepen our Catholic faith in Christ. A Salute to Bob Mayer

The parable of the ten virgins at the wedding feast (Matthew 25) reminds us all to be spiritually prepared, "because you do not know the day or the hour when the Lord will call you." In our prayers this month is brother Knight Bob Mayer, who passed away unexpectedly on December 12th. Knowing the person Bob was, and having him as a friend for almost thirty years, I'm sure he was ready to meet our Lord. Many of you know him as our Parish's Business Manager; however, before that, he and his son Ryan were very involved in St. Mel's Scout Troop 217, while also owning and running his own successful business.

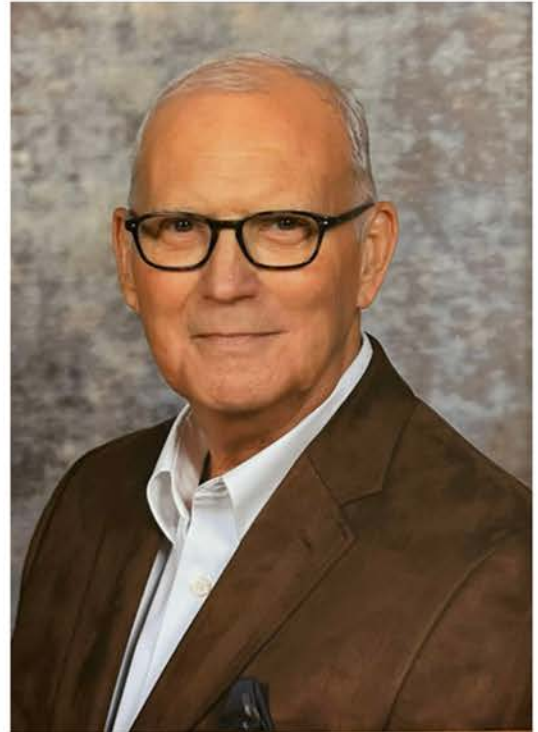
Bob was a buyer, which involved a bit of travel occasionally. He spent time, for example, in China, purchasing unique gift items that he would provide to stores like Macy's to sell. He definitely understood how to run a business. One of our brother Knights, Omar Carrasco, mentioned to me recently that a few years back, he was considering going into business on his own. He went to Bob for solid advice on how to go about it. Omar said Bob gave him the basics he needed.

Bob was also an integral part of the growth of St. Mel Scout Troop 217. When he came on board with Owen Cunningham, brother Knights Denny Shunta and Dennis Riebold, they really set the Troop on fire. The Troop went from about 9-10 members up to 60 or 70 through their efforts, producing over 32 Eagle Scouts. Although the total number of Scouts in the Troop has fallen over the last few years, they still graduate new Eagle Scouts frequently. Bob served as an assistant Scoutmaster of a Scout patrol and as Chairman of the Troop Committee during his time with 217. He also contributed to the next level, the Scouting District, which 217 is a part of. Bob implemented new programs and improved the efficiency of existing initiatives.

I remember well the first campout my son and I attended with the Troop at Camp Far West outside of Wheatland. We, rookies, showed up to set up the campsite just as the rains started (and continued through the night). My patrol did their best, but a few of the boys woke up to about six inches of water floating inside their tents the next morning. Turns out they hadn't set their tarps just right under the tents correctly. Bob was there to show them the right way that Saturday morning and help them dry everything out as the sun began to shine. We have lots of other stories from those times, like the time Bob had a raccoon visit his tent on Angel Island or our evening adventures at Salt Point State Park, camped next to a bachelor party in the woods.

Bob provided sound wisdom and guidance not only to the boys in Scouts, but to our Council of Knights here at St. Mel. After retiring from business and taking on the mantle of Business Manager for St. Mel, he worked with us side by side, even down to the smaller details, like how to operate the coffee maker in the Parish Center kitchen. Annually, and throughout the year, he worked with us to help establish workable dates for our events and meetings in the Parish Center, while overseeing the updating of the grounds at St. Mel. He worked hand in hand with our school and was very respected by the administration and staff. We have been very fortunate to have him behind the scenes of the events we hold in the Parish Center, regarding tables and chairs being set up, providing a dance floor when needed, and employing Parish resources to help the other ministries as well.

Bob was a steadfast anchor in our swirling sea that we could depend on. He will surely be missed for his friendship, wisdom, and advice that he shared freely with others. Please keep Bob and his family (wife Patti, son-Ryan, daughter-Tracy) in your prayers.

Benefits of Joining the 4th Degree of the Knights of Columbus

When Blessed Michael McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus in 1882, there were only three degrees in our Order, Charity (1st Degree), Unity (2nd Degree), and Fraternity (3rd Degree). In the late 19th century, there was some discrimination against Catholics. One reason for this discrimination was that people thought that Catholics were more loyal to the Pope than they were to the United States of America. The Knights of Columbus wanted to show that Catholics could be loyal to, and love both our faith and our country, so they created the Patriotic Degree, the 4th Degree of our Order. The first exemplification of the 4th Degree occurred on February 22nd, 1900, in New York City. In February 2025, the Knights of Columbus will celebrate the 125th Anniversary of the 4th Degree of our Order.

The Mission of the 4th Degree is to honor our Veterans, support Sir Knights and their families at a time of loss, and conduct Patriotic educational programs.

Reasons to become a 4th Degree member of the Knights of Columbus:

- The 4th Degree is the highest degree of our Order.
- 4th Degree members earn the title of Sir Knight (SK).
- Because you love our country, and you love our faith.
- When the time comes that God calls you home, you are eligible for the 4th Degree Honor Guard to be present at your Memorial Service. This benefit is also extended to your Spouse, your Parents, and your Children. This honor is not available to 3rd Degree members.
- Chalice Program – In your memory upon passing, your name is engraved on a Chalice with the names of 3 other Sir Knights from our Assembly. These Chalices are donated to priests around the world, and you are remembered every time the Chalice is used in Mass.
- You are eligible to participate as a member of the Knights of Columbus Honor Guard.
- We typically do no fundraisers. Our annual dues of only \$30 allow us to support Seminarians and purchase Chalices for the Chalice Program.

Election for The Doheny Fund Director 2026

The Father Richard Doheny Religious Education Fund (The Doheny Fund), a registered 501(c)(3) charity, was established by Knights of Columbus Fair Oaks Council # 6066 to support individuals pursuing Catholic instruction, including Seminarians, students attending a Catholic high school, and the St. Mel OCIA program. The Doheny Fund has five Directors, each elected to a 5-year term. One Director's term ends each December 31st on a rotating basis. The Director term, which ended December 31, 2024, is currently held by George Perkins. George is interested in continuing as a Director, but the Board seat is open to any member in good standing of the Knights of Columbus Fair Oaks Council 6066. If you are interested or know anyone interested in serving as a Director of The Doheny Fund, please contact me or any of the Directors listed below before the January 8, 2026, General Meeting of Fair Oaks Council 6066. Nominations will be accepted before and during the meeting on January 8, 2026.

The main fundraiser for The Doheny Fund is the St. Mel Rummage Sale, scheduled for June 2026. All Directors must be committed to preparing for and conducting the rummage sale from start to finish. Many hours go into organizing the sale, especially the week of the event, when we accept donations, sort the treasures, sell as much as possible, and then clean up the hall after the sale. All leftovers must be packed for final donation to a charitable organization, such as the St. Vincent de Paul Society.

Our bylaws state the election will be made by the majority vote of the following individuals: (1) the thirteen elected and appointed officers of the Knights of Columbus Fair Oaks Council #6066, and (2) the Financial Secretary of the Knights of Columbus Fair Oaks Council #6066. The election will be held at the conclusion of the General Meeting.

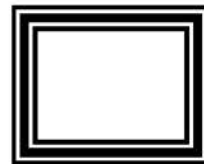
