Hey Chris! What's the Story?...Council Golf Tournament

What is happening with the Council Golf Tournament this year? The immediate thing you need to know is that our Golf Tournament scheduled for Monday, August 31st at Rancho Murieta has been cancelled. Fortunately, we will get our \$500 deposit back on that contract for the 31st. Why did we feel we had to cancel the Golf Tournament? The challenge we had this year is we were unable to generate enough support from the Council to put it on. The golf tournament needs a good, strong golf committee of 8-9 people, who work on it for at least 6 months in order for it to be successful. We got a contract and a date from Rancho Murieta back in March, however we were unable to get enough volunteers to work on it these last few months.

How did the discussion go at the July Business Meeting concerning the Golf Tournament? I brought the current status of the Golf Tournament up at the July Business meeting, and came away with two different paths to consider. The first direction, based on the limited number of volunteers for the golf committee, the lack of sponsors for our tournament (you need sponsors to attract golfers to the tournament and to lower the cost of putting it on), and the short time frame left for organizing a tournament, led to a motion on the floor to cancel the event altogether. I did ask the assembled members how many were regular golfers and only got two Council members to stand up and state that they usually only played once a year. That led to a discussion that perhaps it is time to go in a different direction and replace the golf tournament with other events. The second direction that was brought up was to move the tournament to the spring. The motion was tabled to cancel, at least until I had checked with Rancho Murieta on the status of our responsibility to follow through with the 8/31 contract in place. What happened next?

Our contact at Rancho Murieta voided the 8/31 contract and directed her Board of Directors to refund the \$500 deposit. In addition, she offered a new date in the spring on Monday, April 26th, 2027 if we are interested. This would require a new contract and we would have to check and see if their prices had changed for our event. We are not committed to Rancho Murieta at this time and we had previously investigated the possibility of moving to a golf course closer to home in the spring. These are all things that are possible.

Now what? Now the Council has to decide, and do we have the volunteers to form a committee to start planning a spring golf tournament. Or do we move on to other options? This should be decided in the next month or so and then we can follow through accordingly. Let's make a decision at the August or September Planning Meeting.

Who is Blessed Father Michael J. McGivney?

Who founded our order and where did these principles we live by come from?

The answer is Blessed Father Michael Joseph McGivney. Michael was the oldest child of Irish immigrants, born in Waterbury, Connecticut in 1852. When he was 13, he left school to work in a brass factory, making spoons. At 16, he entered the seminary in Quebec to study for the priesthood. Unfortunately, his father died in a factory accident, when he was 20, and Michael left the seminary to help support his family. Later, he finished his education in Baltimore and was ordained a priest in the diocese of Hartford in 1877.

Assigned to St. Mary's Parish in New Haven, Father McGivney was active in Parish and civic affairs. He even volunteered to be a guardian of Alfred Downes, a minor whose father had passed away, leaving a large family in poverty.

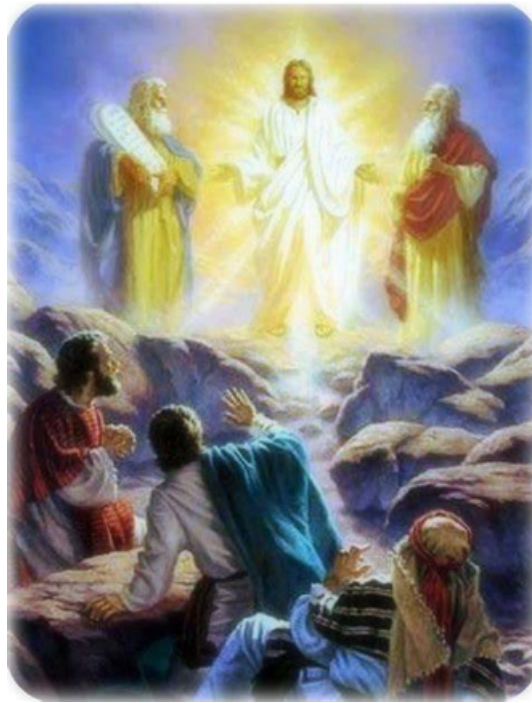
This background led Father, in 1882, to organize a small group of parishioners in the basement of St. Mary's. Their goal was to promote charity, unity, and fraternity, assisting widows and orphans. In 1900, patriotism was added as a founding principle as well. Father insisted that it be an organization run by lay men. In doing so, he anticipated, by almost a century, Vatican II's call for empowerment of the laity in living out a universal call to holiness and evangelization.

Blessed Father McGivney ministered to his parishioners during the pneumonia pandemic of 1889-90, dying himself after contracting the disease in 1890. He was beatified in 2020 by Pope Francis, who said, "Father was a genuine Pastor who was unafraid to share, "the smell of his sheep." Answering the challenges of his own family circumstances and other immigrants, he founded our ministry.

The Transfiguration of Jesus: A Reflection

The Solemnity of the Transfiguration of the Lord will be on Thursday, August 6th of this year. This is one of the great miracles of Jesus, especially great in my opinion because it is at this time when James, John, and Peter saw the complete Trinitarian form of our Lord. The spirit came down on the mountain. Jesus (all white and bright in splendor) stood before them with Elijah and Moses, and they heard the voice of God the Father say, “This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him.” (Matthew 17:5).

We are called to transfigure ourselves for our Lord. We work daily on the conversions of our own hearts so as to be holy as God wishes us to be. As members of a race that has been corrupted by sin since the days of Adam and Eve, this is such a hard thing to do. We constantly fall short on our paths to righteousness. By the mercy of God, though, we are always able to pick ourselves up, dust ourselves off, and get back onto the “grand divine wagon.”

It kind of makes me think of Alcoholics Anonymous. I’ve never been an alcoholic, but I can’t help but think about how AA is there to help those who struggle with alcoholism and are trying to change themselves for the better. Like alcohol, sin can be addictive. Like those alcoholics that are trying to free themselves from their addiction, we are all trying to free ourselves of sin. Like AA, we have a path we can follow, and that path is Jesus Christ. Just like with AA, if we slip, we can go back. If we sin, we have the Sacraments of Confession and the Eucharist to pick us up and to rebuild ourselves. I guess we can consider Confession as SA (Sinners Anonymous). I will continue to work on transfiguring myself to be better for our Lord and I pray that we all will be successful in our own transfigurations.

Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The Assumption of Mary celebrates when our Blessed Mother, at the end of her earthly life, was taken body and soul into heaven, as was defined by Pope Pius XII on November 1, 1950 in his apostolic constitution *Munificentissimus Deus*. It is celebrated on the 15th of August, and this year it falls on Saturday. It is not considered a day of obligation, however, I would encourage attending Mass on that day if possible and spend some time with her and her Son in the Eucharist. The word “assumption” derives from the Latin word *assumptiō*, meaning “taking up.”

The equivalent of the Assumption of Mary in the Eastern church is the Dormition, or the “Falling Asleep,” of the Mother. In the Lutheran Churches, August 15th is celebrated as the Feast of St. Mary. A number of Anglican denominations observe August 15th under various titles, including the Feast of Saint Mary the Virgin or the Falling Asleep of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

There is much debate about how early the Assumption of Mary has been celebrated in the Church. We do know from records that the teaching of the assumption of Mary became widespread across the Christian world as early as the 5th century and was established in the East by Emperor Maurice around 600 AD.

The *Passing of the Blessed Virgin Mary*, attributed to Joseph of Arimathea, is a later version of the Virgin Mary's Dormition, probably from sometime after the early seventh century. One of the apostles, often identified as Thomas the Apostle, was not present at the death of Mary, but his late arrival precipitates a reopening of Mary's tomb, which is found to be empty except for her grave clothes. Subsequently, Mary drops her girdle down to the apostle from heaven as testament to the event. This incident is depicted in many later paintings of the assumption.

As we know from Revelation 12:1, “*And a great portent appeared in heaven, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars...*,” after her Assumption, Mary was crowned Queen of Heaven and Earth. This year, let us show our Mother and Queen how much we love her by honoring her Assumption.

The Importance of the Silver Rose

One of the important life affirming programs that the Knights of Columbus has is the Silver Rose Program. It is a way for both Knights and parishioners to uphold the commitment of life in their respective church communities through prayer and reflection. The Silver Rose Program began in the 1960s when the Columbian Squires, which is the youth organization affiliated to the Knights of Columbus, decided to honor Our Lady of Guadalupe. They organized a pilgrimage of an actual rose from Canada to the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico, to celebrate the miracle of roses. One year later, the Knights adopted the program with a silver rose crafted by a Mexican jeweler. Its original purpose was to celebrate Our Lady of Guadalupe through a pilgrimage across North America. However, in 2001, then Supreme Knight Karl Anderson transformed the Silver Rose program to link it to the pro-life cause the Knights have in saving and helping babies, the unborn, and their families.

Today, the Silver Rose Program remains one of the most important cornerstones of the Knights' commitment to the cause of life as well as fundraisers for ultrasounds for life centers and in holding baby supply drives throughout the year through Respect Life initiatives. This year, the Knights at St. Mel are proud to bring the Silver Rose pilgrimage to our parish on August 22nd, after the 4: 30 PM Mass. This is a great opportunity for the St. Mel community to gather in prayer in not only upholding life, but to celebrate that all of us are unique human beings to God Himself.

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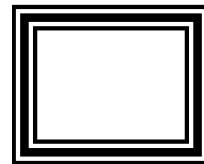
